| Jan. 24, 2008 | SSG Arthur<br>U.S. Army     | \$1,371.54 | Shot five times in an ambush, his VA rating dropped, decreasing his income. The VA hospital where he receives treatment is 70 miles away. He is looking for employment and his wife is supporting the family.   | \$1371.54 for mortgage payment  |
| Jan. 24, 2008 | LCpl Jeremy<br>USMC         | \$4,543.32 | Shot by a sniper with an armor piercing round. It went through bullet proof glass, his vest and his left lung, causing it to collapse. The bullet lodged between his heart and spinal cord and he lost 1/4 of his lung when it was removed. He and his wife relocated to a home with no stairs and she took time from work to assist with his rehabilitation.   | \$4,543.32—\$2,248 for three months rent, \$1,000 for a new washer and dryer, \$442.90 for three months phone, \$350.15 for three months cable, \$285.64 for three months electric, \$216.63 for three months water |
| Jan. 24, 2008 | SPC Randall<br>Army Reserve | \$1,074    | Left a job as a diesel mechanic when activated and deployed to Iraq. Worked long hours treating refugees, many injured by IED blasts. His area was frequently hit by mortar fire. He began experiencing anxiety, PTSD symptoms and his memory was affected. He is unable to return to his previous job.   | \$1,074—\$670 for truck payment, \$300 for phone, \$104 for storage unit  |
| Jan. 14, 2008 | SGT Daniel<br>U.S. Army     | \$2,039.98 | After leaving a civilian job to serve an Iraq, an IED caused a ruptured eardrum, broken back and TBI. The back and head problems were not diagnosed until later, when his back had fused. Surgery now has a high risk of paralysis. Side effects from his medication make finding employment difficult.   | \$2,039.98 for mortgage payments  |
| Jan. 14, 2008 | SGT Jeremy<br>U.S. Army     | \$2,120    | A roadside bomb explosion penetrated four inches of armor, lodging a massive amount of shrapnel into his arms, face neck and pubic area. His left radial bone was crushed causing major nerve damage and a small piece of shrapnel split his nose in half causing major sinus damage. He also suffers from PTSD. After a divorce, he returned home to live with his mother and is appealing his disability claim. | \$2,120—\$1,100 for car payment, insurance and credit card, \$820 for loan payment, \$200 for phone   |

Shrapnel lodged in his right eye, causing optical nerve damage and he also suffered a gunshot wound to the left leg. Due to the damage in his eye, he is unable to return the job he had before being activated.                                    | \$2,775.32—\$1,419.64 for mortgage payment, \$736.22 for car payment, \$616.46 for second car payment.       |
| Jan. 10, 2008 | CPL Carlos<br>U.S. Army  | \$242.44   | His humvee was hit by an IED causing the vehicle to roll. He was the sole survivor and suffered severe injuries, including multiple fractures to his leg and ankle. Once he is discharged from the hospital he will require long term rehabilitation through a cold therapy approach.   | \$242.22 for a cold therapy ankle unit, not covered by military insurance                                    |
| Dec. 26, 2007 | CPL Jeremy<br>U.S. Army  | \$7,500    | Received brain injuries from two IED blasts in Iraq.  | \$7,500 to assist with home modifications to accommodate his disability                                      |
| Dec. 19, 2007 | Capt Jeffrey<br>USAF     | \$2,557.69 | Involved in a vehicle accident that threw him from the car, causing damage to nerves in his back. No head imaging was done during his initial treatment but brain injury was later discovered, along with PTSD, depressive disorder and leg tremors. His medication made it impossible to carry a weapon and he was medically discharged.               | \$2,557.69—\$1,832.68 for mortgage payments, \$500 gift card to Target, \$225.01 for electric bill           |
| Dec. 13, 2007 | 2LT John<br>Army Reserve | \$2,150    | A shoulder injury from a car bomb and a lower back and hip injury combined with PTSD and depression led to his medical discharge. Employment is impossible due to his medical problems and he is awaiting the results of an appeal to his disability rating.  | \$2,150 for mortgage payments  |
| Dec. 13, 2007 | SGT Devin<br>U.S. Army   | \$2,000    | An IED struck his vehicle causing shrapnel injuries to the right shoulder and a heavy blow to the head, left knee and lower back. He was awarded the Purple Heart and continued serving. After returning home, maintaining a job while maintaining treatment for his injuries proved difficult so he joined the reserves and hopes to return full time. | \$2,000—\$700 for rent, \$600 for car payment, \$346.96 for credit card, \$192.84 for phone, \$160 for cable |

| Nov. 29, 2007 | LCpl Colin<br>USMC        | \$3,300  | A single gun shot wound to the head from an insurgent sniper's armor piercing bullet caused a severe traumatic brain injury. He was not expected to survive but has surpassed doctors' expectations with his recovery. His father left his job to provide daily therapy transportation to rehabilitation.        | \$3,300—\$1,575 for rent, \$150 for phone, \$300 for electric, \$375 for insurance  |
| Nov. 16, 2007 | GySgt Mel<br>USMC         | \$3,500  | A wounded service member himself, he is starting a new outdoor activity program aimed at helping wounded Marines learn that their injuries are manageable and life can return to normal.   | \$3,500 gift card to REI for equipment and supplies   |
| Nov. 15, 2007 | SPC Abraham<br>U.S. Army  | \$1,900  | The explosion from a mortar round severely injured his dominant arm, shattering his elbow and damaging his radial nerve. He is unable to use the arm, and also suffered a head injury, loss of hearing and other shrapnel injuries. His family was relocated and put into military housing but lacked furniture. | \$1,900—\$1,400 for a queen size mattress and box springs (purchased at a reduced rate from Sleep Train.) \$500 gift card to Target for bedding |
| Nov. 15, 2007 | LCpl Patrick<br>USMC      | \$752.90 | Hit by a grenade during a firefight in Fallujah. Shrapnel destroyed his knuckle and several bones in his hand, and lodged in his pelvis and forearm.   | \$752.80 for a plane ticket home to be with his family during a difficult time  |
| Nov. 12, 2007 | SGT Kirk<br>U.S. Army     | \$5,000  | Suffered from back problems and severe PTSD and depression upon returning from Iraq. His disassociated state led to the destruction of his home in a fire and financial problems made it difficult to find a new home.   | \$5,000 to assist with home repair  |
| Nov. 6, 2007  | SPC Derek<br>Army Reserve | \$371    | Hit by an IED in Iraq, he was transferred to Texas for surgery but ultimately died from wounds suffered in the blast.  | \$371 for lodging expenses for his aunt and grandmother who traveled to be by his side  |

| Oct. 30, 2007 | SPC John U.S. Army        | \$1,526    | After being activated and sent to Iraq, an IED blast injured his ACL and left him permanently deaf in both ears. His fiancée had to relocate to care for him, causing a financial strain  | \$1,526—\$750 for rent, \$686 for car repair, \$90 for three months car insurance  |
| Oct. 29, 2007 | CPL Christopher U.S. Army | \$500      | An IED blast shattered the bones in his right and left legs. He lost his spleen, injured his back and suffered internal injuries due to shrapnel in the abdomen. After more than a year in the hospital he was relocated to military housing but without furniture for his family.  | \$500 to purchase mattresses and bedding   |
| Oct. 29, 2007 | Cpl Joshua USMC           | \$4,039    | A landmine accident resulted in a severe spinal cord injury, loss of memory, broken ribs, separated shoulder, shrapnel fragments, internal bleeding and PTSD. An error led to a disability rating that does not provide sufficient benefits and he is unable to work due to his injuries. It will be several months before the rating is corrected and benefits increase. | \$4,039—\$2,047.32 for credit card bills, \$1,991.68 to assist with payments for new furniture   |
| Oct. 16, 2007 | Sgt Nicholas USMC         | \$778      | An IED explosion fractured his left leg and rib cage, shattered his right foot, broke four vertebrae in his back and punctured his right lung. He is dealing with TBI and PTSD as well. A new baby and relocation expenses have led to financial difficulties.  | \$778 for a new washer and dryer   |
| Oct. 11, 2007 | SPC Terry Lee U.S. Army   | \$1,874.61 | After being wounded and medically evacuated from Iraq, he has been suffering from PTSD, asthma, bronchial spasms, angioedema, diabetes and hearing problems. Finding employment has been a struggle and his wife is expecting.  | \$1,874.61—\$1,055 for rent, \$315.12 for electricity, \$285.04 for credit card bills, \$83.98 for phone, \$76.54 for gas, \$58.93 for water                                   |
| Oct. 11, 2007 | SPC Nicole U.S. Army      | \$500      | Returning to their camp in Iraq, the convoy was struck by an IED and received small arms fire, resulting in burns to over 12% of her body.  | \$500 to use for new clothing to block direct sunlight   |

| Oct. 5, 2007   | SPC Helmer<br>U.S. Army     | \$1,245.33 | Injured by an IED blast, resulting in TBI, cracks in the brain, PTSD and combat stress. An error on the part of the military related to orders for his family's travel expenses left them without reimbursement and struggling with expenses.  | \$719.17 for credit card bills, \$525.16 for phone bills   |
| Sept. 28, 2007 | SPC Ryan<br>U.S. Army       | \$5,649    | Wounded by a roadside bomb that killed two and injured nine. Lost a large portion of his thigh and buttock in the blast and suffered multiple shrapnel wounds. His wife was killed in a car accident in 2005, leaving him a single parent to two children. He is awaiting medical benefits and doctors say he can work a desk job in 8-10 months.  | \$4,455 for three months of house payments (to avoid foreclosure,) \$657 for three months of car payments, \$537 for three months of insurance       |
| Sept. 25, 2007 | SGT Patrick<br>Army Reserve | \$6,451.67 | During combat operations in Iraq, his unit took small arms and indirect fire. A mortar landed 25 feet away and he suffered multiple shrapnel wounds, a split retina and TBI. He moved his unit out of the kill zone and carried two wounded off the battlefield. He received the Bronze Star for meritorious service and the Purple Heart. A reservist, he left his job when he was activated and his income decreased considerably. The family dipped into savings so that they could be by his side during his recovery. | \$5,871.66 for payments on their first mortgage, \$580.01 for payments on their second mortgage.   |
| Sept. 25, 2007 | SPC Aaron<br>U.S. Army      | \$6,000    | Shot by a sniper in Iraq, leaving him paralyzed from the middle of his back down. While at a doctor's appointment, the family's house burned down. Lacking insurance, they lost everything.  | \$4,500 for deposit and rent, \$1,500 for a new mattress and box-spring  |
| Sept. 12, 2007 | Sgt Heath<br>USMC           | \$5,000    | Was in the turret of his vehicle while on patrol in Iraq and took the full blast of a roadside bomb. He received a Purple Heart and was classified as 80% disabled as a result of his brain injuries.  | \$5,000 to help with rent for several months so that he can take unpaid leave from work to receive treatment in order to regain cognitive functions. |

His wife left her job to care for him and their three children.  | \$2,600 for two months past due mortgage payments to avoid foreclosure, \$884 for four months past due utilities, \$789 for three months past due car payments to avoid repossession, \$516 for past due car insurance to avoid cancellation |
| Sept. 6, 2007 | Christin W.             | \$5,500  | An accident in Iraq left Christin's husband with chronic PTSD. Considered a possible threat to others, he was put on medical leave and hospitalized. Unable to afford daycare, she cannot work, and is pregnant with their third child.   | \$4,000 for past due mortgage payments, \$800 for phone bills, \$500 for past due loan payments, \$200 for car insurance   |
| Sept. 6, 2007 | SPC Edward<br>U.S. Army | \$2,200  | An IED struck the humvee of which he was the gunner. The blast killed three of his close friends, and left him with a chemical burn to the right eye, vision loss, TBI and PTSD. He was medically retired but got behind on bills while hospitalized. He found a new job but needs a residence before he can begin. | \$2,200 for a deposit and first and last month's rent payments   |
| Sept. 4, 2007 | SPC Saul<br>U.S. Army   | \$757.60 | Lost both legs during an IED attack of which he was the sole survivor.  | \$757.60 for a plane ticket for Saul's close friends to visit  |
| Aug. 28, 2007 | Vicky H.<br>USAF        | \$500    | Injured in a vehicle accident, resulting in broken bones, neck and spinal damage, depression, anxiety and migraine headaches. She is returning to school but waiting on government funds.   | \$500 for textbooks and gas to travel to class   |
| Aug. 27, 2007 | Anthony S.<br>U.S. Navy | \$547.40 | Was treated for PTSD, suffering from depression and suicidal ideation as well as substance addiction. He has been unable to work and his mother is battling liver disease.  | \$547.40 for a plane ticket home to visit his mother   |
| Aug. 23, 2007 | LCpl Hardy<br>USMC      | \$1,500  | Suffered a broken scapula and lost right leg when hit by a mortar; a bullet to the back severed his spleen. | Aug. 17, 2007 | Jesena S.              | \$2,000    | Jesena's father was killed by an IED in Afghanistan. She shares a room with her mother within her grandparents' house and sleeps on a twin mattress on the floor. Her SS and VA benefits are used for childcare.   | \$2,000 to purchase bedroom furniture  |
| Aug. 17, 2007 | SPC Mark U.S. Army     | \$7,000    | An IED blast resulted in disfiguring facial wounds, a broken jaw, head trauma, neck and back injuries. The force of the blast threw him into the steel walls of the vehicle he was riding in, causing shrapnel wounds. He has 14 upcoming surgeries and his wife lost her job during a 3-month leave of absence to care for him. They are unable to afford daycare for their 4 children. | \$6,400 for four months of mortgage payments to avoid foreclosure, \$600 for two months of car payments  |
| Aug. 17, 2007 | PFC Rolly U.S. Army    | \$8,125    | A roadside bomb severely damaged his right leg; it was nearly lost to gangrene. Nerve damage leaves him in constant pain. His wife left him for someone she had been seeing during his deployment, leaving \$10,000 in debt as well.   | \$4,300 for five months of past due rent payments, \$1,950 for three months past due car payments, saving the car from repossession and allowing him to continue driving to medical appointments, \$1,200 for past due utilities, \$675 for three months of past due car insurance bills |
| Aug. 17, 2007 | SSG David Army Reserve | \$2,186    | A shot to the left temple by a sniper caused brain damage, hearing loss and blurred vision. He was also hit by RPG shrapnel from an attack on his medevac, and contracted pneumonia during his recovery.   | \$1,286 for medical equipment to assist with facial reconstruction, \$900 to repay a loan from his parents who came to care for him after his wife left abruptly   |
| Aug. 10, 2007 | Anthony S. U.S. Navy   | \$1,620.25 | Was treated for PTSD, suffering from depression and suicidal ideation as well as substance addiction. | July 25, 2007 | SPC Nathan<br>U.S. Army | \$3,000  | Was nearly fatally wounded after being stabbed 16 times in Iraq. Medically discharged, he is 80% disabled and unable to work.  | \$1,700 for three months of mortgage payments, \$1,300 for three months of car payments                                 |
| July 25, 2007 | Gregory B.              | \$4,000  | Wounded first in Afghanistan, recovered, and was redeployed to Iraq. An RPG attack blew him out of the vehicle causing severe damage to his left leg, thigh and hip and leaving shrapnel in his left side. | \$4,000 to assist with car payments and mortgage payments, to avoid foreclosure   |
| July 10, 2007 | Cpl Ryan<br>USMC        | \$315.30 | Medically discharged after being wounded in Iraq.  | \$315.30 for a plane ticket to return to Camp Pendleton after moving his pregnant wife to their new home in Arkansas    |
| July 9, 2007  | SSG Chess<br>U.S. Army  | \$584.80 | While on the way to assist a platoon that had come under fire the unit was ambushed. | June 29, 2007 | LCpl Jason<br>USMC            | \$589.34 | An IED blast resulted in a blown eardrum and a stage 2 concussion; injured hip while training at Camp Pendleton but recovered and will be redeployed to Iraq.   | \$589.34 for car repair so that his wife can drive the children to her parents' home in another state when her husband is redeployed                      |
| June 28, 2007 | LCpl Hardy<br>USMC            | \$3,000  | Suffered a broken scapula and lost right leg when hit by a mortar; a bullet to the back severed his spleen.   | \$2,200 for his wife's cancer treatments, \$800 for mortgage, car and utility payments  |
| June 28, 2007 | Robert S.<br>U.S. Army        | \$5,500  | Was medically discharged after being wounded by an IED attack, is cared for by his mother who had to leave work to be by his side.  | \$3,900 for three months of mortgage payments, \$1,500 for vehicle repair   |
